Community

Prescott is a growing community located about 100 miles northwest of Phoenix. Most of the residents in the tri-city area (which includes Prescott Valley and Chino Valley) are business and professional people. Total population of the tri-city area is approximately 110,000 based on 2022 estimates.

School and District

Tri-City College Prep includes a $7^{th}-12^{th}$ grade charter school centrally located among the towns of Prescott, Prescott Valley, and Chino Valley. Founded in 1999, Tri-City College Prep's district is the Mary Ellen Halvorson Education Foundation.

Enrollment is 281, with 38 seniors who will graduate in 2025. Tri-City College Prep has college prep accreditation through Cognia. An education at Tri-City College Prep gives all the benefits of a private school without the hefty price tag. Tri-City College Prep consistently achieves the distinction of being "A rated" from the Arizona Department of Education.

Class Rank

At Tri-City College Prep we do not rank our students. We feel that due to the caliber of our students, ranking them would give an incomplete, and in many cases an unfair representation of their academic abilities. We feel that a better perspective can be gained by an inspection of their transcript, noting the academic rigor of their classes as well as their weighted and unweighted grade point averages.

Advanced Curriculum

Tri-City College Prep offers dual credit college classes on campus through its partnership with Yavapai College. College classes currently available to students are: Math through College Calculus II, English 101 and 102, American Sign Language I and II, Administration of Justice, and Computer Networking Technology/Cyber Security. Tri-City College Prep also offers select Advanced Placement courses including AP Biology and AP U.S. History.

Scholastic Recognition

Tri-City College Prep consistently outperforms the state average on Arizona Achievement Assessments in proficient/highly proficient. This includes 34% in Math and 32% in ELA. Tri-City College Prep also consistently outperforms the state average in every category tested on the ACT. This includes exceeding the Arizona Average in English and Reading by 13% and Math by 13%. Over recent years, the student body at Tri-City College Prep has met all four benchmarks measured on the ACT 13% more than other Arizona schools.

Outstanding students are invited to apply for membership to National Honor Society, Science National Honor Society, English National Honor Society, Mu Alpha Theta (Math National Honor Society), Tri-M (International Music National society), and Art Honor Society.
